# **INEC Seeks CSOs' Help to Mobilise** for CVR in Edo, Ondo Governorship **Elections**

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) has called upon Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) to aid in mobilizing potential registrants for the Continuous Voter **Registration (CVR) exercise** preceding the Edo and Ondo States governorship elections. INEC Chairman, Prof. Mahmood Yakubu, issued the appeal during the second quarterly consultative meeting with CSOs in Abuja yesterday. This call

comes after the commission announced the CVR timetable for both states, scheduled to occur simultaneously from Monday, May 27, 2024, to Wednesday, June 5, 2024, between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm daily, including weekends. The Edo State gubernatorial election is slated for Saturday, September 21, 2024, while the Ondo election is set for Saturday, November 16, 2024.

### **Early Voting bill passes first** reading at the Senate

As an offshoot of the pitfalls observed in previous elections, the Senate has initiated the amendment of the Electoral Act 2022 to improve Nigeria's electoral process. Senator Abdulaziz Musa Yar'adua introduced a bill for first reading proposing early voting, enabling registered voters to vote before the election day. This is geared towards addressing the concerns of those unable to vote on the designated day, including election workers, journalists, observers, and security personnel.



### Ensure Justice Prevails, CSOs Urge Imo Election Tribunal

Eight Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) based in the South-East region have collectively called upon the judiciary to ensure justice prevails in the forthcoming judgement of the 2023 Imo Governorship Election Petition Tribunal. This appeal was expressed in a joint communique issued by the CSOs following their meeting in Owerri on Friday. As the tribunal gears up to deliver its verdict, the CSOs emphasized the significance of addressing the grievances of individuals who felt disenfranchised during the election.

Following the conclusion of party primaries and the end of the period for withdrawal and substitution of candidates as provided in the Timetable and Schedule of Activities for the election, the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) has published the names of candidates for the Edo Governorship Elections.

### How governors undermined independence of state electoral commission – INEC boss

**INEC** Chairman Prof. Mahmood Yakubu urged state governors to ensure that State Independent **Electoral Commissions** (SIECs) are enabled to perform their duties independently and effectively, rather than being used to endorse specific candidates. He highlighted issues of SIECs being improperly constituted, underfunded, and understaffed, which forces them to rely on INEC for basic logistics like ballot boxes. Speaking to the Forum of State Independent **Electoral Commissioners of** Nigeria, Yakubu emphasized the need for state electoral bodies to stop "coronating" candidates and focus on conducting credible elections.



### Ondo Guber: INEC to publish personal particulars of candidates Saturday

The Independent National **Electoral Commission** (INEC) has announced plans to publish the personal particulars of the Ondo Governorship candidates and their running mates on Saturday 25th May 2024, as provided by Section 29(3) of the Electoral Act 2022. Made known in a press statement by its National Commissioner and Chairman, Information and Voter Education Committee, Mr Sam Olumekun, the commission disclosed that a total of 17 political parties have uploaded their candidates' nomination forms for the Nov. 16 Ondo State Governorship Election.

### Terminate All Pre-Election appeals at the Court of Appeal - Judicial Officers

Justices of the Court of Appeal and other judicial officers involved in the 2023 election tribunals have called for an amendment to Section 246 (3) of the Constitution to ensure that all election-related appeals, including governorship disputes, are resolved by the Court of Appeal. They advocated that all pre-election appeals should conclude at the Court of Appeal and that the Constitution should mandate that both pre and post-election issues be resolved before elected officials are sworn into office


