Senior Advocate of Nigeria (SAN) Jibrin Samuel Okutepa has urged the Nigerian judiciary to fulfill its role in deepening democracy, particularly in light of the controversies surrounding recent elections. Speaking at the first Inter-Party Advisory Council (IPAC) roundtable in Abuja on Thursday, where he delivered a keynote address titled "The Role of the Judiciary in Nigeria's Democratic Sustainability," Okutepa highlighted widespread doubts about the judiciary's ability to remain impartial and above reproach in political cases

INEC releases final voter registers for Edo, Ondo governorship polls

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) has released the final voter register for the upcoming governorship elections in Edo and Ondo states. According to a statement issued in Abuja on Tuesday by Sam Olumekun, INEC's National Commissioner and Chairman of the Information and Voter Education Committee, Edo has 2,629,025 registered voters, while Ondo has 2,053,061.

INEC clears 44,687 party agents for Edo guber election

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) has announced that a total of 44,687 polling and collation agents will participate in the September 21 governorship election in Edo State.



According to a list released by INEC, this figure includes agents for 43,043 polling units, 1,452 wards, 179 local councils, and 13 state collation centers. Sam Olumekun, INEC's National Commissioner and Chairman of the Information and Voter Education Committee, noted that the commission had anticipated 80,410 agents from the 17 political parties contesting the election. However, only 55.6 percent of the expected agents were nominated, with one party failing to nominate any agents at all.




