THE ARTIST






BLOOM OF DEMOCRACY




PEOPLES VOICES

THE ARTIST





It is a call to action, urging us to confront the systemic injustices that led to this atrocity and to continue demanding accountability from those in power. In the spirit of Art for Democracy, this artwork challenges us to question the true meaning of democracy and the value of human life in Nigeria. 



god's eyes captures the essence of Nigeria's democratic journey over the past 25 years from an omnipresence point view, embodying the complex interplay of emotions and generational experiences as they play in democratic processes. The six conjoined heads represent the continuum of life—youth, middle age, and old age—each bearing facial expressions as a consequence of their engagement with democracy. right, the old man's acceptance, borne from the youth's active participation in voting, symbolizes the rewards of engagement—a fulfilled democratic process. Conversely, on the left, the sadness of the old man whose youthful counterpart did not vote highlights the missed opportunities and the heavy price of disengagement.


